Our Club has designed, in cooperation with KMWP, a progressive education and engagement project that will culminate with an Earth Day tree planting project and celebration. <b>Help Understanding and Group Support (HUGS)</b>	<b>SHOPPING WITH FAMILIES FROM HUGS HOUSE</b> Holiday shopping at Walmart with 3 - 5 families (up to 15 persons) to purchase small home and personal items. The families have a child at HUGS due to a severe medical condition and are very financially strapped due to high medical expenses. This is our annual "Rotary Gives Thanks Day" project. <b>Homeless Outreach and Medical Education (H.O.M.E.)</b>	<b>In partnership with the John A. Burns School of Medicine,</b> our club will purchase vaccines and provide new equipment for the examination room in the H.O.M.E. Project Medical Van. The van is staffed by a group of volunteers mostly from the JABSOM and provides free medical care to 7 homeless sites weekly. POC James Ham	
<b>US VETS KALAELOA</b>	<b>US VETS Facility Garden Upgrade Project.</b> Our Club will provide manpower and supplies to upgrade their community garden that has not been upgraded for a long time due to COVID restrictions. The proposed project is for our Rotarians, U.S.VETS staff, other volunteers, and veterans on site to work together to work out a design plan to revitalize the garden.
